Student Leaders GRIP Conference



Congratulations to our newly elected student leaders! Last Friday, they had the opportunity to participate in the annual GRIP Leadership Conference at the Perth Convention Centre. GRIP Leadership is an organisation dedicated to developing leadership skills in school students. Our leaders engaged in a full day of activities designed to enhance their leadership abilities and provide practical strategies they can use to support students at Mundijong PS.

Brekkie Club

Riding / Walking to School

You may have seen some of us standing on the corner of Livesey and Paterson Streets counting cars over the last few days. We're investigating the possibility of getting a crossing attendant to help our students safely cross the busy Paterson Road. To qualify, we need a minimum of 200 cars and 20 people crossing this road an hour before and after school.

We will lodge a submission with the shire, and if approved, the application will be sent to WA Police for further approval. We've already had two near misses with students on bikes/scooters at this intersection this year. If your children ride or walk to school, please talk to them about crossing Paterson Road safely.



Pets at School



This year we have 244 students attending MPS. Whilst It's great to see our small school growing, it's causing a few issues when it comes to parking, particularly at drop off and pick up times. For our students' safety, we ask that cars move around the school in only an anticlockwise direction and only park on the school side of the road. Unfortunately, we don't have enough room to have traffic going in both directions, and having cars parked on the school side of the road avoids students running across the road. The gate at the bottom of the oval is open and it's been nice to see some parents/carers parking along Richardson Street.



BUSHFIRE PLAN


Our school is identified as being in a bushfire risk area and has been placed on the Bushfire Zone Register. This means that we are required to complete a bushfire plan annually. In the case of a bushfire in our area, students will be evacuated to the library, where we await further instructions from Emergency Services. If needed, students will be evacuated to a nearby school by bus. If this situation arises, parents would be asked to pick their child up from the evacuation location. Rest assured, we have effective ways of communicating with you if this occurs. On Tuesday 4 March we will be having a Bushfire Emergency Drill, and students will practise moving from their classroom to the library. This gives staff an opportunity to practise this emergency procedure.

NAPLAN

Our students in Year 3 and 5 will be sitting the NAPLAN Assessments in a few weeks' time. These assessments may make some students anxious. Please reiterate with your kids that this is just another test, they sit tests all the time, and let them know that they just need to do their best. We'll be giving them the same message.



Hello Mundijong Primary Community!

I hope you have had a wonderful, smooth and positive couple of weeks to start 2025 school term. I am enjoying connecting again with students and extending a special welcome to those who are also new to Mundijong PS.

My joy is helping students with social and emotional skills and empowering them to find resilience and courage for the things they face in life. The two Chaplain days per week this year will be every Thursday and Friday.



Chaplaincy is chiefly about Pastoral Care and support. Parents/carers can access me by calling the office to make an appointment or have me call back; leave a message with your child's teacher; or email me on anni.crouch@youthcare.org.au. Students can pop a note in my letterbox just outside my office or catch me on my days.

My Musing

One of my grandsons became a big brother just before he turned four last month with the birth of a baby bro. He's become a mischievous one and things are constantly being taken without permission, broken or wrecked, pets treated really roughly, cheeky in how he speaks, disobedient...phew! I've concluded that these are all symptoms of feeling (perhaps unconsciously) usurped as Mummy's baby boy and his having a craving for attention. Saying it in another way, I think his attention/love bucket is a bit empty and he needs it to be filled again. The sweet boy returns when one of us gives him quality time one on one...maybe quality time is his primary love language! (i.e. that is a chief way of how he feels loved).

As a Chaplain, kids often tell me sadly that they miss their parent who doesn't seem to have time for them - either due to busy-ness with other siblings, with work, or just by the parent seeming to be on their phone all the time. All kids need quality time with their main caregivers, but particularly some that may have it as their primary love language. Without it they feel unloved. With it, they feel loved, become happier and more secure, more careful, more compliant. I encourage you to check in with your child, make space for some special time and filling their love bucket.

For Dads

The Fathering Project is a great resource of ideas for dads on parenting no matter what age their kids are. There is a weekly snappy focus and practical tip that can be sent you via email, as well as podcasts, virtual Dad's groups and in person workshops. Dads! 
VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS






Kolton In Action
